Royal Treatment

THE OWNERS OF this Tudor home had their list of needs and wishes, many of which were conspicuously missing in the crowded, outdated U-shaped design. To help them transform the space into an open, user-friendly room that stuck with the style of the home but had all the amenities of a modern-day kitchen, they hired Francis Jones, CKD, CBD, of Callen Construction, Inc.

The first major task was relocating the laundry room, which received much of the incoming and outgoing traffic. The space left from the old laundry zone gave the kitchen new dimension that offered new design opportunities. For instance, Jones crafted an over-10-foot island, which serves as the room's focal style point and usage center. Oversized, it houses the cooktop, oven, and plenty of storage.

Jones also placed the refrigerator at the island's end for unrestricted access to eating and entertaining areas. He located the microwave next to the fridge, making on-the-go cooking even easier for this busy family. The sink was kept on the outside wall under the window, with views to the outdoors. This prep space also houses a pullout waste and recycle center, tilt-tray storage, the dishwasher, and a water filtration system.

Various additional design refinements helped complete this medieval makeover, and the homeowners couldn't be more thrilled with the results. «
